### Mobile phone free school

Please may we remind you that our expected mobile phone and device policy is now 'live' in schools, as of April 1<sup>st</sup> 2026. This means that no one on site – this includes children, staff, visitors and contractors – is permitted to have a mobile phone in areas that children may be present.

Children in Years 4 – 6, who need to bring a mobile phone to school, to support their safety to and from school, are to be provided with a non-smart phone **only**. If your child brings a mobile phone into school, our expectation is that:

- The mobile phone is labelled by you and easily distinguished from others
- The mobile phone is on silent and switched off
- The mobile phone is locked away in the school office
- The mobile phone remains locked away, until the end of the school day
- Children will not turn their mobile phones back on, until they are off site

If a child is found with a mobile phone on their person, during the school day, this will be confiscated and parents informed. Thank you for your support.
