# Attendance

As you will all be aware, every child's attendance is tracked very carefully and we do this because our job is to make sure that your child receives the education that they deserve. We know and can see that if a child misses more than 4% of school a year, they will not reach the educational standard expected of them and their attitude to school is at risk of becoming negative and challenging.

Our attendance target for this academic year is now 96%, which is the national average.

Please take note of the grid below, as this will tell you how much school your child misses each year that they fall below the expectation of 96%. This could be the difference of not achieving and achieving at the age related expectation by the time that your child finishes Primary School.
