

Communication and Language

Listening and attention

WALT develop two-channelled attention – listen and do

Understanding

WALT respond to instructions involving a two-part sequence.

WALT understand humour

WALT follow a story without pictures or props

WALT listen and respond to ideas expressed by others

Speaking

WALT extend our vocabulary, exploring the meaning and sounds of words

WALT use different language to support our imagination and to help us with recreating roles and experiences in play situations

WALT discuss answers with our peers whilst sequencing, stories in the correct order from beginning, middle and end

WALT incorporate a storyline or narrative into our play

Literacy

Reading

WALT continue a rhyming string

WALT hear and say the initial sound in words

WALT segment the sounds in simple words and blend them together

WALT begin to read words and simple sentences

WALT enjoy an increasing range of books

Writing

WALT give meaning to marks that we make when drawing, painting and writing.

WALT use some clearly identifiable letters to communicate meaning, representing some sounds correctly and in sequence

WALT write our own names and other things e.g. labels, captions

Physical Development

Moving and handling

WALT experiment with different ways of moving

WALT jump off an object and land appropriately

WALT negotiate space successfully when playing racing and chasing games

WALT travel with confidence and skill around, under, over and through balancing and climbing equipment

WALT use simple tools to effect changes to materials

WALT form recognisable letters

Health and self-care

WALT understand that good practices such as exercise, eating, sleeping and hygiene can contribute to good health.

WALT understand the need for safety when tackling new challenges, and consider some risks

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Self-confidence and self-awareness

WALT confidently to speak to others about our needs, wants, interests and opinions

WALT describe our self in positive terms and talk about our abilities

Managing feelings and behaviour

WALT understand that our actions can affect other people

WALT be aware of the boundaries set and of behavioural expectations in the setting

WALT be able to negotiate and solve problems without aggression

WALT initiate conversation, attending to and taking account of what others say

WALT explain our knowledge and understanding, and ask appropriate questions to peers and adults in the class.

Mathematics

Numbers

WALT recognise numerals from 1 to 5

WALT count up to 3 or 4 objects by saying one number name for each item

WALT begin to count to 10 and beyond 10

WALT count up to 6 objects from a larger group

WALT estimate how many objects we can see and check this by counting

WALT use the language 'more' and 'fewer' to compare two sets of objects

WALT find the total number of items in two groups by counting all of them

WALT say the number that is one more than a given number

Shape, space and measures

WALT use mathematical names for 2D and 3D shapes

WALT describe and name 2D and 3D shapes

WALT use positional language to locate an object

WALT use familiar objects and common shapes to create and recreate patterns and build models

Understanding the World

People and communities

WALT enjoy joining in with family customs and routines in our own play.

WALT comment and ask questions about aspects of the familiar world including the natural world

WALT talk about things we have observed such as plants and animals

WALT show care and concern for living things and the environment

WALT look closely at similarities, differences, patterns and change
