Reading:

The children will be reading the story of **Rose Campion and the Stolen Secret** by **Lyn Gardner** over the course of the half-term and focus on the following objectives:

- WALT: draw inferences such as inferring characters' feelings, thoughts and motives from their actions, and justify inferences with evidence.
- WALT: predict what might happen from details stated and implied.
- WALT: identify main ideas drawn from more than one paragraph and summarise these.
- WALT: identify how language, structure, and presentation contribute to meaning.
- WALT: retrieve and record information from fiction.

Writing:

Weeks 1 and 2:

WALT: Write a setting description of Victorian London

Week 3 & 4:

WALT: Write a missing chapter showing an interaction between a villainous character and a hero.

Weeks 5 and 6:

WALT: Write a letter in role a young girl (Effie) to her mother.
