Reading:

Understanding of the World

HISTORY: A History of Slavery & its abolishment.

(An aspect of British history that extends pupils' knowledge since 1066)

WALT: understand key historical events of the slave trade.

WALT: understand the significance slavery had nationally and globally.

SCIENCE: Animals including humans

Identify and name the main parts of the human circulatory system, and describe the functions of the heart, blood vessels and blood
