Literacy

Week 1 and 2

Children will be retelling the story of Jack and the Beanstalk.

Week 3

Children will be retelling the story of Jack and the Beanstalk with a twist.

Week 4 and 5

Children will be retelling the TRUE story of the three little pigs.

In writing children will be using their knowledge of sentences with different forms: statement, question, exclamation, command, expanded noun phrases to describe and specify, past tenses: including the progressive form and using the subordination (when, because) and co-ordination (and, but) conjunctions. In reading children will be developing their comprehension skills as well predicting the main events of the stories.

Physical Development

Dance (3): Children will explore unison and canon in group work Create a short dance in a group Apply unison and canon to their short dance Explore performing the same movement in different ways Make changes to movement and use canon in a group dance

Games (2):

Children will confidently use rolling actions to roll towards different targets with a partner Kick a ball with a partner and then against a partner using simple tactics Strike a ball to score points Throw in different directions over different distances Make up a simple scoring method for a game Throw, catch, roll, strike, and kick towards different targets Work well with a partner

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

PSCHE: Good to be me

Children will learn about doing something to be proud of Children will develop skills in responding in an assertive way and stand up for ourselves

Children will learn how to help someone with a worry Children will develop strategies to know how to stop and think when they are angry

R.E.: Christian Faith and Values

Children will learn about the bible. How do Christians look after their special book? What is special to us and how do we look after it?

Children will explore the importance of the bible and how Christians use this to learn about God and how this may affect their daily life – explore the ten commandments and discuss what we can learn from this. Can we make a list of classroom commandments to follow? Children will explore stories from the bible and what we can learn from these.

Mathematics

Children will be consolidating their skills in fraction of shapes

Children will learn to find fractions of numbers and solve fraction problems

Children will learn about the properties of 2D and 3D shapes

Understanding of the World HISTORY: Human and Physical Geography

Children will explore the human and physical features of the local area through creating maps and first hand field work.

They will also link this to their work on traditional tales – identifying key physical and human features.

SCIENCE: Living Things and their habitats

Children will be sorting and grouping animals and plants, discussing similarities and differences. Children will explore habitats and how animals are adapted to their environment.

Children will be investigating microhabitats, they will predict what plants and animals would be found in different microhabitats. They will create a tally and pictogram of the mini beasts found in different habitats. Children will be making a habitat for a chosen mini beast.

Children will use camera to evidence and support work in science.

Children will record role play and drama as part of English.
