# Literacy

#### Reading

The children will be reading the story of **Kensuke's Kingdom** by **Michael Morpurgo** over the course of the half-term and focus on the following objectives:

- -WALT: draw inferences such as inferring characters' feelings, thoughts and motives from their actions, and justify inferences with evidence.
- -WALT: predict what might happen from details stated and implied.
- -WALT: identify main ideas drawn from more than one paragraph and summarise these.
- -WALT: identify how language, structure, and presentation contribute to meaning.
- -WALT: retrieve and record information from fiction.

#### Writing

- -WALT: Recognise vocabulary and structures that are appropriate for formal speech and writing, including subjunctive forms.
- -WALT: Use hyphens to avoid ambiguity.
- -WALT: Use brackets, dashes or commas to indicate parenthesis.
- -WALT: Use semi-colons, colons or dashes to mark boundaries between independent clauses.
- -WALT: Use passive verbs to affect the presentation of information in a sentence.
- -WALT: Use the perfect form of verbs to mark relationships of time and cause.

#### Athletics:

- -WALT: Use running, jumping, throwing and catching in isolation and in combination.
- -WALT: Develop flexibility, strength, technique, control and balance.
- -WALT: Compare performances with previous ones and demonstrate improvement to achieve a personal best.

- -WALT: Explore how to change an unfair situation.
- -WALT: Congratulate someone for their achievements.
