

Engage: Create our own dinosaur eggs and go on a dinosaur egg hunt.

Spoken language:

Use spoken language to develop understanding through speculating, hypothesising, imagining and exploring ideas
Articulate and justify answers, arguments and opinions
Participate in discussions, presentations, role-play, improvisations and debates

Give well structured descriptions, explanations and narratives for different purposes, including expressing feelings

Reading:

Participate in discussion about what is read to them, taking turns and listening to what others say.

Discuss word meanings, linking new meanings to those already known

Listen to and discuss a wide range of poems, stories, and non-fiction at a level beyond that at which they can read independently

Writing:

Say out loud what they are going to write about

Compose a sentence orally before writing it

Sequence sentences to form short narratives

Re-read what they have written to check that it makes sense

Discuss what they have written with the teacher or other pupils

Physical Development

Gymnastics

WALT: Master basic movements including running, jumping, throwing and catching, as well as developing balance, agility and co-ordination, and begin to apply these in a range of activities

WALT: Perform dances using simple movement patterns

Understanding the World

GEOGRAPHY: Locational Knowledge

WALT: Name and locate the world’s seven continents

WALT: Explore in greater detail the continents where dinosaur remains have been found

HISTORY: Events beyond living memory

WALT: Develop our knowledge of the three dinosaur periods: Triassic, Jurassic, and Cretaceous
WALT: Place events and objects dating back to the dinosaur period up until modern day in chronological order

WALT: Understand why dinosaurs became extinct

WALT: Learn how fossils are formed

SCIENCE: Animals including ourselves

WALT: Identify and name a variety of common animals, including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals

WALT: Identify and name a variety of dinosaurs that are carnivores, herbivores and omnivores

WALT: Describe and compare the structure of a variety of common animals

WALT: Compare vertebrates (**Dinosaurs**) with invertebrates

COMPUTING: Algorithms

WALT: Understand what algorithms are; how they are implemented as programs on digital Devices

WALT: Understand that programs execute by following precise and unambiguous instructions

Expressive Arts and Design

ART: Painting

WALT: Experiment with mixing paints by creating your own dinosaur egg – painting on hard boiled eggs.

WALT: Experiment with different printing techniques by creating a dinosaur painting using only your fingers

WALT: Explore the work of J M W Turner and his use of water colours, recreate his style in a dinosaur landscape painting

WALT: Mould your own dinosaur using clay

D&T:

WALT: Design a dinosaurs packed lunch based on your knowledge of carnivores, herbivores and omnivores

WALT: Create dinosaur fossils using corn-starch and water. Excavate at a later date.

MUSIC: Singing and playing instruments
