Spoken Language:

Understanding of the World

Geography

WALT Name and locate counties and cities of the United Kingdom, geographical regions and their identifying human and physical characteristics, key topographical features, and land-use patterns; and understand how some of these aspects have changed over time

WALT Describe and understand key aspects of:

- physical geography, including: climate zones, biomes and vegetation belts, rivers

- human geography, including: types of settlement and land use, economic activity including trade links, and the distribution of natural resources including energy, food, minerals and water

WALT Use fieldwork to observe, measure, record and present the human and physical features in the local area using a range of methods, including sketch maps, plans and graphs, and digital technologies.

Science: Living things and their habitats

WALT Recognise that living things can be grouped in a variety of ways

WALT Explore and use classification keys to help group, identify and name a variety of living things in their local and wider environment

WALT Recognise that environments can change and that this can sometimes pose dangers to living things.

Computing: iProgram

WALT understand that a program is a sequence of statements written in a programming language

WALT understand that computer programs consist of statements that perform a specific task.
