









'Walk this Way'

How many steps can you walk on your way to school?

The aim of this competition is to increase the number of children who walk to school each day. The Junior Travel Ambassador's will be monitoring the number of steps that each child walks to school each day. Class teachers will need to record the total number of steps that the children have walked each day. The Junior Travel Ambassador's will visit every class and calculate the total amount of steps that each class has walked for that morning. The Heads of School will calculate the total number of steps walked across the week for each class. One class will become the 'winning' class and will win a prize. The child who has walked the most steps out of all children will also win a prize.

What you will need to do ...?

- Every child will be given a step counter.
- All step counters will need to be attached to their jumper/coat to make it fair – children must not 'shake' their step counter as this will incorrectly add steps. This will be cheating!
- On arrival to school, the children will need to show their step counter to the adult in their class, who will record the number of steps that the child has walked.
- The Junior Travel Ambassador's will be responsible for calculating the total number of steps for each class.
- The Heads of School will calculate the final steps at the end of the week.
- Each family will be encouraged to send a photo of their child walking to school as evidence that they actually walked to school. This can be uploaded to the Google Classroom.
- The winning class who has managed to walk the most steps will each receive a prize. The prize will be a pedometer and a certificate. They will also be able to go on a walk with their class.
- The child who has walked the MOST steps will also receive a prize a pedometer and a badge.
