What to expect in January 2021

At Lonesome Primary School we continue to work within the **Guidance for full opening: schools updated 26 November 2020.** There is very little change in terms of the expectations of schools. The guidance from the Government clearly states that 'there cannot be a 'one-size-fits-all' approach where the system of controls describes every scenario. As the school leader I continue to manage the complex organisation of the school to make informed judgments about how to balance the needs of the community and delivering a broad and balanced curriculum with the measures needed to manage risk.

We will continue to organise all children in planned year group bubbles so that we can reduce the risk of transmission by limiting the number of children and staff in contact with each other to only those within the group. This means we will need to continue to stagger the children's start and end to the school day. After considerable curriculum and premises reorganisation we have managed to secure trusted safe practices, without compromising the learning being planned.

We will continue to review our risk assessment alongside any new and updated Government guidance and inform families when anything changes.

Attendance update

Our attendance percentage has taken a bit of a drop this last week at **93.9%**. Let's hope that the children stay well for these last two weeks in school, as we have lots of fun learning planned for them.

Thank you for your ongoing understanding with the many changes and adaptations to school life that we continue to make.
