







Saves Lives

The children and staff will be required to take part in four heart themed activities on our themed day. For each activity that the children complete, they will receive a piece of the puzzle in order to build their emotionally and physically healthy heart.

The activities include:

- -A beating heart puzzle piece: an obstacle course.
- -A hungry heart puzzle piece: the designing of a 'healthy heart' lunch box
- -A grateful trail heart puzzle piece: a timed obstacle course to express gratitude
- -A kind heart puzzle piece: performing three acts of a kindness to a friend on this day

Once the children have built their heart puzzles, they will be rewarded with a certificate to take home to celebrate their hard work througout the day, knowing they have made a difference to their own heart and the hearts of others.
